# Lead Efforts to Advance Parity and Modernize Scope of Practice

APMA is working to ensure that podiatrists are recognized and permitted to practice to the full extent of their education and training, in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations. Here are highlights of our work, including collaborating with state component associations.



# **Advocacy Win!**

### **OPTUM RESCINDS ITS MISCLASSIFICATION OF PODIATRISTS**



In response to APMA's coordinated advocacy effort, Optum recently reversed its decision to reclassify podiatrists and recognized podiatrists are independently licensed physicians who undergo specialized education and training. This change in course reaffirms the vital role podiatrists play in advancing clinical outcomes and caring for patients. APMA is proud to have led this collective advocacy effort and thanks

state components, societies, members, and other stakeholders for their strong and relentless advocacy on behalf of the entire profession and patients.

## **Advocacy by State**



#### **MASSACHUSETTS**

APMA urged the Massachusetts Legislature to modernize the podiatric state scope of practice statute to include treatment of the ankle. We continue to work with the Massachusetts Foot and Ankle Society (MFAS) to increase support from national stakeholder groups for the MFAS bill.



#### **MISSISSIPPI**

We're collaborating with the Mississippi Podiatric Medical Association to modernize scope of practice legislation that would allow podiatrists to treat the foot and ankle.



#### **NEVADA**

APMA is working to stop the Nevada legislature from merging the podiatry board into a consolidated allied health board.



#### **NEW YORK**

APMA is thrilled to congratulate the New York State Podiatric Medical Association (NYSPMA) on a

behalf of our mutual members! The NYSPMA modernized scope bill has been approved by both the New York Senate and Assembly. The bill now awaits the Governor's signature.



#### US

- ➤ Thanks to APMA advocacy efforts, the House passed the SUPPORT ACT (HR 2483), which includes a technical fix to the MATE Act. A Senate companion bill has been introduced.
- The VA CPE Modernization
  Act (HR 657) has been
  re-introduced. This bill
  would reimburse Veterans'
  Administration podiatrists for
  continuing medical education
  as done for MD/DOs.

# Ensure Fair Reimbursement & Financial Security

APMA advocates to ensure fair and sustainable payment rates for services provided by podiatrists.

Physician payment has declined over 30 percent since 2001 when adjusted for practice cost inflation, also known as the Medicare Economic Index.

Advancing Medicare physician payment reform is one of APMA's primary legislative priorities. APMA urges Congress to implement structural reforms to the Medicare payment system, including the establishment of an annual inflation adjustment for physicians.

- APMA led a sign-on letter with 42 other state and national podiatric medical societies urging Congress to preserve and protect Medicare and Medicaid patient access to podiatric physicians in the One Big Beautiful Bill.
- Congress passed the One Big Beautiful Bill in early July, securing a 2.5-percent Medicare physician payment increase for 2026 and preserving the SALT deduction for podiatric practices.



## **Addressing Administrative Burdens and Onerous Payer Policies**

While physician payment continues to decrease, administrative burdens from CMS and private payers continue to increase. APMA is fighting to end these onerous requirements for its members.

# FEDERAL AGENCY ENGAGEMENT

- Sent regulatory relief priorities to:
  - HHS Secretary Robert F. Kennedy Jr.
  - CMS Administrator Mehmet Oz, MD
- Responded to White House request for regulatory burden feedback, spotlighting issues such as:
  - The Same or Similar program
  - Therapeutic Shoes documentation burden

### **KEY PAYER ENGAGEMENTS**

- > Aetna:
  - Secured commitment to involve APMA in project to streamline prior authorization process.
  - Engaged on E&M Claim Downcoding policy, gathering data and strategizing responses.

### **ENDORSED LEGISLATION**

Medicare Patient Access and Practice Stabilization Act (HR 879/S 1640).

This bill cancels the almost 2.8-percent cut to the Medicare Physician Fee Schedule and provides an inflationary adjustment.

Improving Seniors' Timely Access to Care Act (HR 3514/S 1816).

This bill streamlines the time-consuming prior authorization process in the Medicare Advantage Program.

APMA Podiatrists Move the World campaign launched with the Foundation for Podiatric Education and stakeholders.

# PROTECTING STUDENT ACCESS TO LOANS > Partnered with AACPM and

- Partnered with AACPM and APMSA on a grassroots campaign opposing harmful student loan proposals in the One Big Beautiful Bill.
- Signed joint letters with over 100 health-care and medical organizations urging the Senate to protect graduate student loan access.
- Proposed alternative policies to key Senate leaders with AACPM and the Association of American Medical Colleges.

# Public Promotion of Podiatry

Nearly 100 podiatrists took part in the 2025 Legislative Conference. Participants spent the first day of the conference preparing for congressional visits and hearing from influential congressional staff. On day two, we took to the Hill, advocating for the profession and sharing the value of care podiatrists provide to their patients and the US health-care system.





- APMA leaders participated in the GOP Doc Caucus' annual House Call on the Mall and engaged with other physician leaders.
- APMA is spearheading a new branding campaign to raise public perception of the profession.
