


## 2022-2023 Scholarship Application



## APMA EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION APPLICATION

The APMA Educational Foundation's mission is to advance the growth and stability of podiatric medicine through student scholarships and increasing nationwide awareness of foot and ankle health. The foundation manages the scholarship program and supports APMA projects and initiatives.

### 2021 Snapshot

- \$330,000 in aid awarded to podiatric medical students
- 192 students supported
- Scholarships awarded from more than 60 endowed funds and other initiatives, including a full-tuition scholarship awarded in partnership with PICA

### Criteria

The APMA Educational Foundation awards scholarships to qualified students at the nine schools of podiatric medicine around the country. The foundation takes into account the following four criteria:

1. Third- and fourth-year standing
2. Financial need, as determined by the US Department of Education.
3. Grade Point Average (minimum 2.5 required).
4. Extracurricular activities demonstrating awareness and commitment to APMA's mission, such as community service, school leadership and/or other student involvement.

### Policies Governing Scholarship Disbursement

- All scholarship applicants must be APMA members. APMA offers complimentary membership to students. To become a member, call 800-275-2762 and ask for the Membership department.
- A committee at each college consisting of 3-5 members, including, but not limited to, the financial aid officer, faculty, and administration members, will assess section criteria, review applications, and make final decisions on student eligibility.
- The APMA Educational Foundation makes payments to each school identifying individual scholarship recipients. The scholarship funds must be directly credited to the student's tuition account.

### Eligibility

- Podiatric medical student in good standing as determined by the academic institution
- Third- or fourth-year student status
- Financial need
- GPA (2.5 and above)
- Demonstrated commitment to APMA's mission by way of podiatric community/school service

The APMA Educational Foundation offers funding from more than 60 named endowment scholarship funds, as well as the Maryland Residency scholarship fund and the foundation's general scholarship fund.

### **APMA Educational Foundation Named Scholarship**

All students meeting the above eligibility criteria will be considered for named scholarships.

#### **Maryland Residency Scholarship**

Two fourth-year students will be selected from the Dr. William M. Scholl College of Podiatric Medicine at the Rosalind Franklin University of Medicine and Science. This independent award is for travel expenses when applying to Maryland residency programs and is awarded *in addition to* any other funds awarded.

#### **APMA-PICA Full-Tuition Scholarship**

This \$45,000 award will go to a student with financial need who demonstrates extraordinary potential. The winner will be selected from a pool of nine final candidates (one per school). **Check here if you wish to be considered, and then answer all questions on the next page, including question 4.** Third-year students will be given preference for this award.

### **Discretionary Awards**

From time to time, the APMA Educational Foundation may elect to make awards in the following categories, depending on available funding. Please indicate if you meet either or both of these eligibility criteria:

#### **First-Generation Scholarship**

First-generation students are those who are the first in their immediate family to attend an institute of higher education in the United States.

#### **International Student Scholarship**

International students are often disqualified by the US Department of Education from receiving federal financial aid. The APMA Educational Foundation seeks to support our profession's international students by offering this award to students currently in the US on a visa and/or students who do not hold US citizenship.
